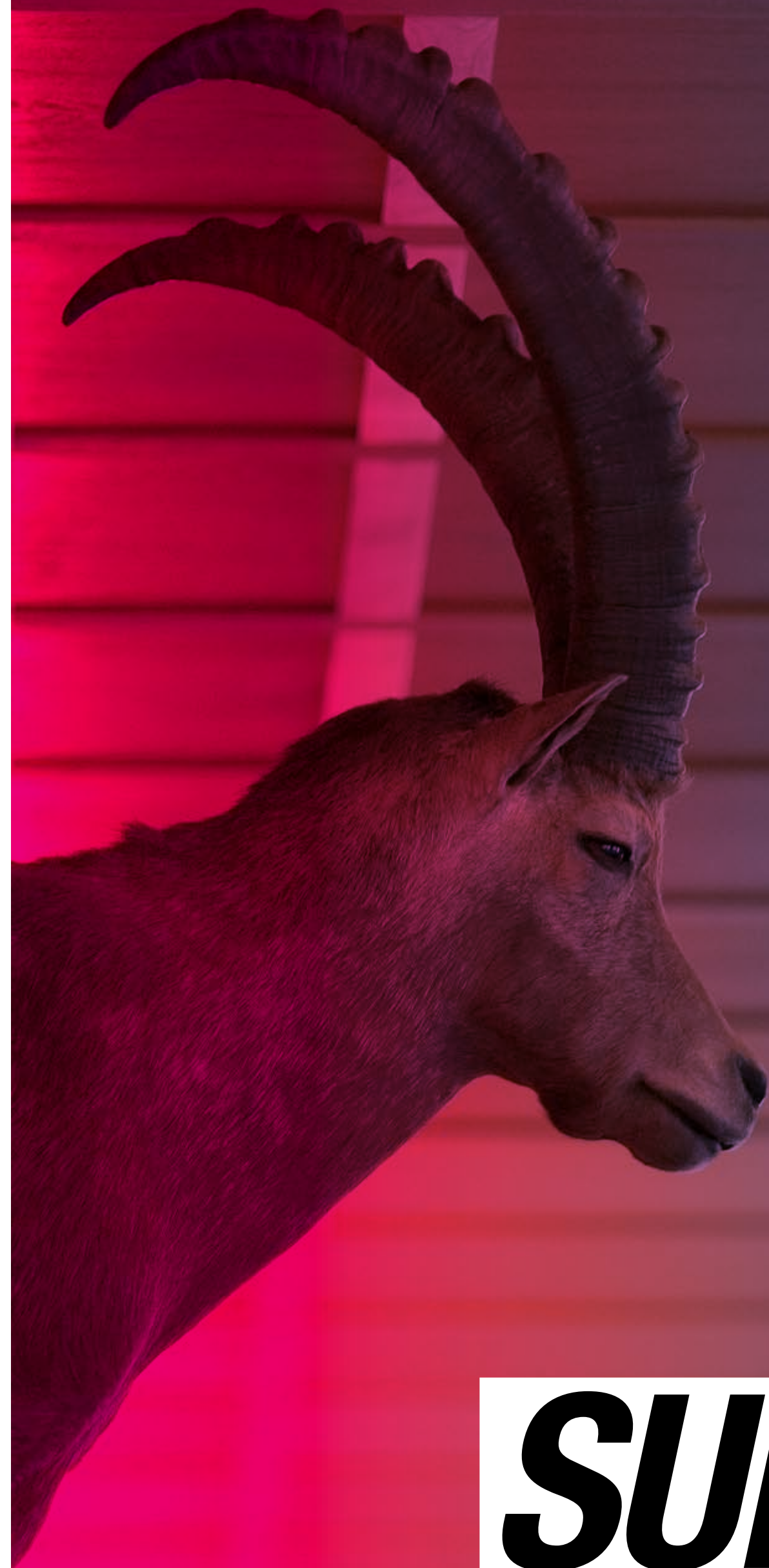

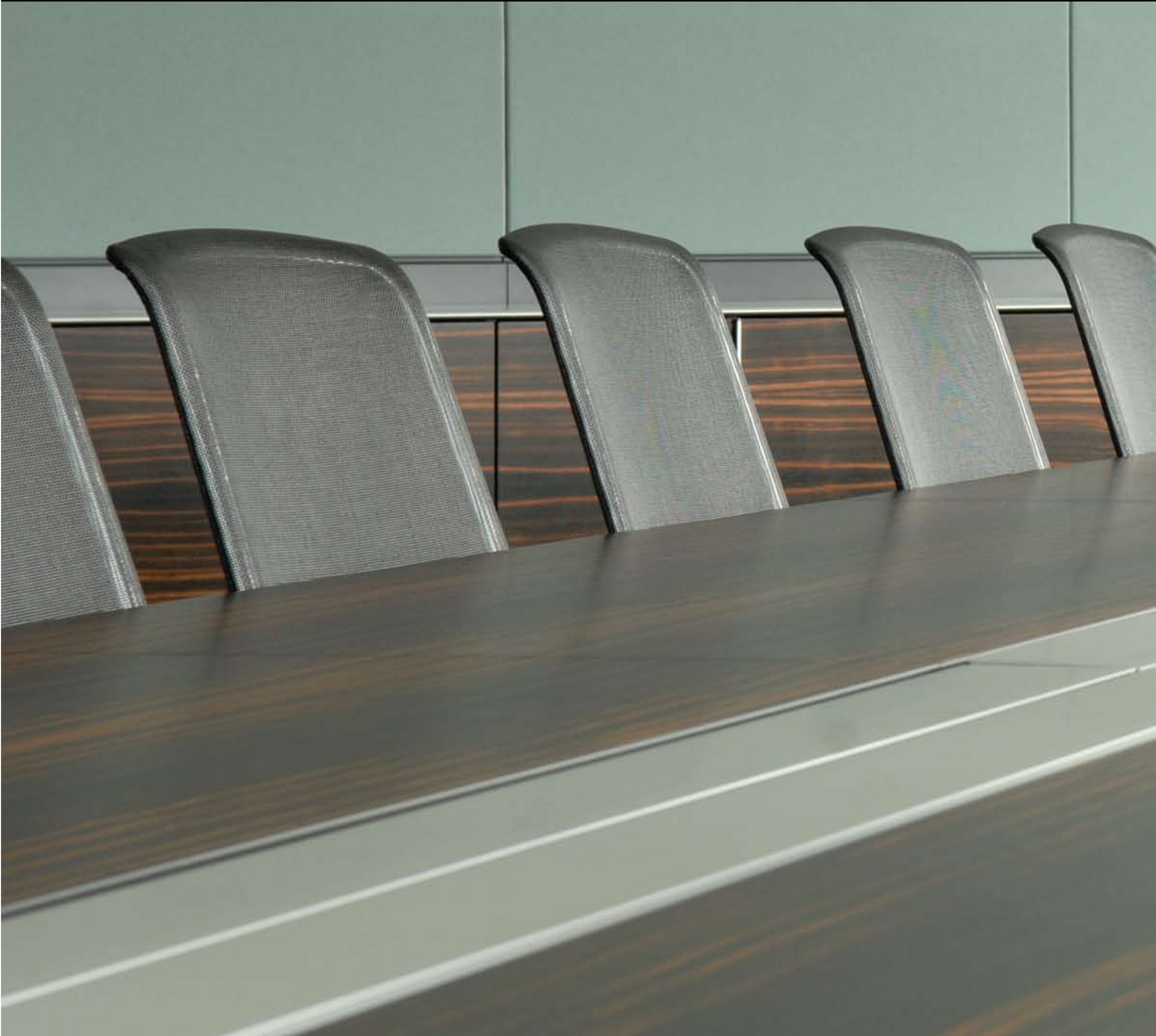
How do you measure the success of a project?

CHRISTIAN LENZ

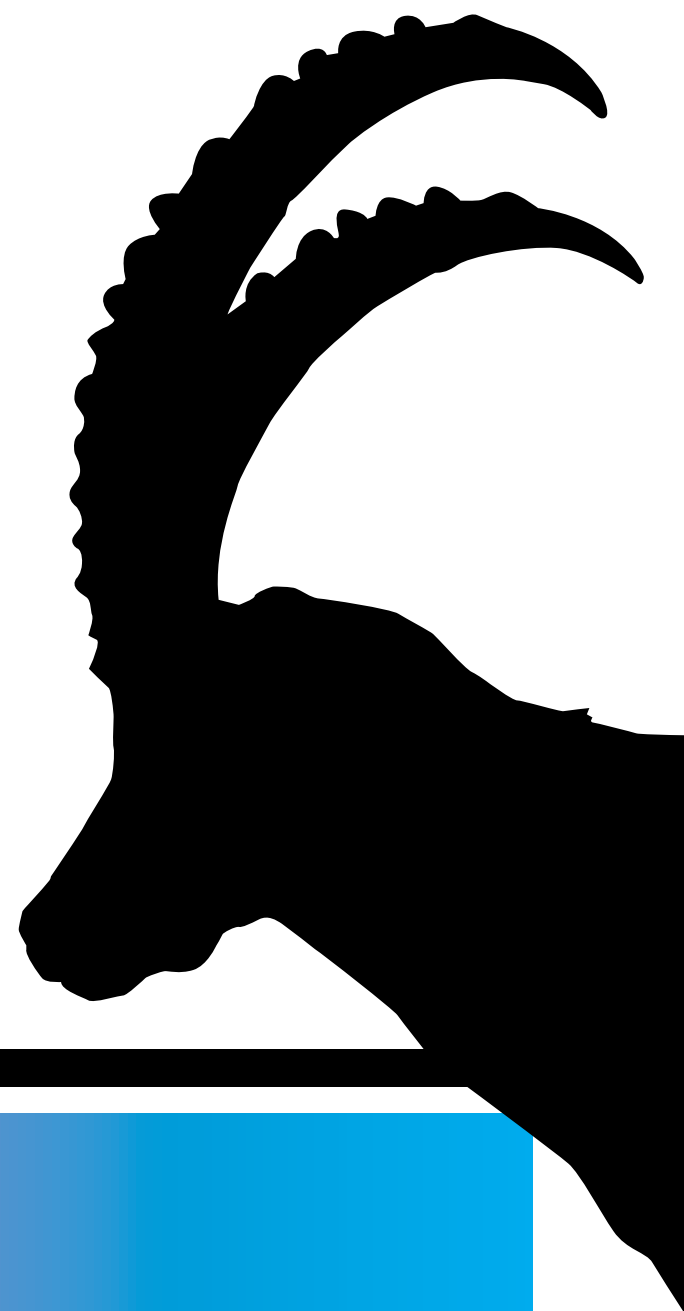
